ABOUT LADIES IN BLACK

Ladies in Black is a heartwarming musical set in 1950s Sydney, exploring themes of ambition, friendship, and societal change. The story follows Lisa, a bright young woman who takes a summer job at the prestigious department store, Goodes, between finishing school and pursuing her dream of studying literature at Sydney University.

As Lisa steps into the world of retail, she meets a group of strong, diverse women who challenge the era's expectations of women's roles in society. At a time when marriage and domestic life were often seen as the only paths for women, Ladies in Black highlights the aspirations of those who dared to dream beyond these norms.

ABOUT IPSWICH MUSICAL THEATRE COMPANY

Ipswich Musical Theatre Company (IMTC) was co-founded by Brenda Ryan and Ken Mundt in 2001 to stage Seven Little Australians, the Musical for the Centenary of Federation. Since then, IMTC has produced boutique shows in the historic Old Courthouse and a major annual production at the Ipswich Civic Centre.

Past productions include Annie, The Wizard of Oz, Oliver, The Sound of Music, The King and I, Beauty and the Beast, The Producers, and The Boy from Oz. In 2014, IMTC staged a sold-out production of The Phantom of the Opera, which won the Citywide Event Award at the 2015 Australia Day Awards.

Recent major shows include Mary Poppins (2015), Wicked (2016), Les Misérables (2017), Strictly Ballroom (2018), Mamma Mia! (2019, first in QLD with an LED screen), Pirates of Penzance (2021), We Will Rock You (2022), The Phantom of the Opera (2023), and Guys and Dolls (2024).

From humble beginnings, IMTC has grown into a nationally recognized community theatre company, known for staging large-scale and technically challenging productions.

ROLES

We are an amateur company.

No roles are paid.

All performers must be 16+ years old by time of performances.

This is not a youth production.

LISA

16 years old. A thin, shy, bookworm, who is described as having neither style nor beauty, yet emerges with both by the end of the story. Highly intelligent, desperate to learn more about literature. Her summer job at Goodes teaches her more about life than she could have imagined.

PATTY/ANNA

32 years old. Unhappily married shop assistant at Goodes. She has failed to have a baby and her husband is chronically uncommunicative, so she has become stitched up and a little malicious as a result. Inside she is vulnerable and unhappy This role has very minor extra part as Anna.

MRS CARTWRIGHT/JOY

A double for an actress of about 40. Miss Cartwright is the blue-stocking, crisply authoritative manager of the Ladies Department at Goodes. She's tall, definitely stylish, all business, having dedicated her life to it, but is not without compassion or wit. Joy is Patty's older sister. Exhausted by motherhood and housework, she doesn't live up to her name.

FAY

29 year old shop assistant at Goodes. Pretty and cheerful, but has had a series of unfortunate relationships with unsuitable men, so she feels insecure about ever getting married and being considered respectable.

MYRA/DAWN/CUSTOMER

A double for a woman in her mid to late 20's.Myra is Fay's best friend - buxom, cheerful and out for a good time. Dawn is Patty's sister - forthright, cynical and rough around the edges. This role has very minor extra part as a customer.

MAGDA

An exotic Hungarian of about 40. In charge of Model Gownes at Goodes, she is the embodiment of European style, glamorous, educated and beautifully presented. While undoubtedly somewhat forbidding, she has warmth, wit and great insight.

MRS MILES/BARMAID/CUSTOMER

Lisa's mother. In her late 30's-early 40's. She dotes on her daughter, is proud of her and wants the best for her, but is nervous of rocking the boat and upsetting her conservative husband. A product of her era, she is neither educated nor sophisticated, but her love for her daughter ultimately gives her courage This role has very minor extra parts as barmaid and customer.

MISS JACOBS/MRS CROWN

A potential double for an actress in her sixties. Miss Jacobs has worked in Goodes her whole life. Nervous and intense, she lives alone and has a sense of tragedy about her. Mrs Crown is Patty's mother. Now widowed, she is a rough diamond who has bought up three daughters and doesn't beat around the bush.

FRANK/MICHAEL

Patty's 35-40 year old husband. Described as gormless. A tile salesman with little ambition or vitality. Humiliated by his potential responsibility for his childless marriage, he hides his low self-esteem in taciturn introspection. This role has very minor extra part as Michael.

RUDI

Mid to late 30's. A Hungarian refugee on the lookout for a wife. He is charming, well-read, irrepressible, a beautiful dancer, and a genuine lover of women.

MR MILES

Man in 40's. Mr Miles is stiff, conservative and authoritarian. He loves his daughter but firmly believes a woman's place is in the home and is baffled by her intellect and ambition.

STEFAN

Man is in his 40's. He is an ebullient Hungarian, intellectual and bon vivant. He is a passionate enthusiast for all things literary.

LLOYD/FRED/VRONSKI

Mid to late 30's. Two Australian men on the lookout for a good time. This role has very minor extra part as Vronski

Roles are open to people aged from 16 years and up. Auditionees must have turned 16 by 1st January 2025. There are no children/youth roles in this production.

WHAT TO PREPARE



Vocal & Acting Audition

- 5 to 10-minute PRIVATE INDIVIDUAL AUDITIONS will be required to show vocal and performance skills at which you will present your song/s and maybe be asked to do a short cold read.
- Please prepare TWO CONTRASTING SONGS (approximately 32 bars of each).
- Songs are NOT to be from Ladies in Black.
- Songs will be performed to your Backing tracks. You can provide your backing track file by email prior to your audition.
- NO ACCOMPANIST PROVIDED. If you bring your own accompanist, please ensure you provide their name in your booking.
- Please provide a CV with headshot. The headshot is for identification purposes only and will not be returned.
